NEWS FROM EUROPEAN COMMISSION

World-Soil-Day 2017 – Land, Soils and Science

December 4 - 6, 2017 – Brussels, Belgium

This event was organized by the European Commission funded Coordination and Support Action INSPIRATION (www.inspiration-h2020.eu) and the Soils4EU service contract to DG Environment. This celebration of World Soil Day was devoted to the topical research needs for soil and land use. The event presented and discussed state-of-the-art and pressing gaps in European research on land and soils from the perspectives of policy makers, funders, end-users of research and scientists.

SOILS4EU workshop on soil ecosystem services and on the transboundary effects of soil degradation.

These workshops were part of the celebration of the World Soil Day 2017 and of the final conference of the H2020 project INSPIRATION on 4-6 December. Both topics were presented during the plenary opening session of the conference on 4 December 2017. At the workshop two in-depth reports on the following subjects were presented and discussed: a) Transboundary effects of soil degradation in the EU and b) Soil ecosystems and their services.

Updated Inventory and Assessment of Soil Protection Policy Instruments in EU Member States

The report lists the existing **soil protection policies and measures at the EU and Member State level** and identifies key gaps in protection with respect to soil threats and functions of the Thematic Strategy for Soil Protection. The report developed an inventory of existing and upcoming policy instruments compiling this information in a collaborative Wiki web platform. The report carried out a cross – policy analysis, examining the coverage of soil threats and functions in EU policies and the strengths, weaknesses, opportunities and threats represented by existing policy. Furthermore, you can find an analysis how the Member State instruments across the EU – 28-complement and address the gaps identified in the EU legislation. Finally the report discussed current and future policy initiatives with experts at Member State and EU level.

EIONET meeting National Reference Centres Soil 2018

January , 2018 – Copenhagen, Denmark

NRC Soil is a thematic Eionet network of soil experts, nominated by the National Focal Points (NFP). Its members identify, analyse and discuss the role of soils in the context of national and Europe-wide environmental policies. They exchange experiences on soil and soil-related information as necessary.

The meeting will discuss the following topics:

- 1) Currently, a “light review” of NRC profiles is coordinated by the EEA and the NFPs in the context of the extension of the current EEA Multiannual work plan to 2020. Within this process, the profile of the NRC Soil is expected to be updated. More information about the review procedure is expected after the upcoming EEA/NFP working group webinar.
- 2) By the 3rd quarter 2018, the first draft of EEA's State and Outlook of the Environment Report (SOER2020) will be developed. Input by NRC Soil will be needed.

Joint Research Centre – European Soil Data Centre (Ispra)

EIONET NRC Soil Ad-Hoc Working Group on Contaminated Sites and Brownfields

The 4th Meeting Ad-hoc WG on Contaminated Sites and Brownfields took place in Ferrara (Italy) on September 20th, 2017. During the meeting the Draft report 'Status of local soil contamination in Europe' based on the replies to results of the Questionnaire on the establishment of the indicator LSI003 "Progress in the management of contaminated sites in Europe" were discussed. The **report "Status of local soil contamination in Europe" - key concerns and observations** will be presented at the upcoming EIONET meeting of National Reference Centres Soil in Copenhagen by January 2018 and get published afterwards. .

European Achievements in soil remediation and brownfield redevelopment

The monograph **European Achievements in soil remediation and brownfield redevelopment** has been published in November 2017, aiming at sharing best practices of soil restoration and management of contaminated sites among European countries. Eight countries present a total of 17 cases which illustrate how soil and brownfields remediation along with sustainable land management have become essential for reversing the trend of soil degradation and ensuring the provision of ecosystem services by soil. The cases show progress in research and innovative technologies of soil remediation, new outstanding approaches to soil remediation management, beneficial integration of stakeholders in decision-making and fruitful progress in raising public awareness and citizen science.

ESDAC Map Viewer

The **ESDAC Map Viewer** allows the user to navigate key soil data for Europe. It provides access to the attributes of the European Soil Database and some additional data related to main soil threats as identified in the Soil Thematic Strategy. The ESDAC Map Viewer is developed according to standards (OGC WMS) so that they are interoperable with similar information allowing real-time integration of environmental data from around the world. The Viewer integrates the European Soil Database layers and some other soil layers in one single web-based application. You may navigate and select each of the: 70 layers derived from the European Soil Database and other soil threats layers:

Global Soil Partnership – Symposium on soil contamination 2018

Global Soil Partnership (GSP) is expected to organise a Symposium on soil contamination which shall take place on 2–4 May, 2018 at FAO headquarters in Rome.

H2020 project GROW Observatory - questionnaire

The GSP/FAO is partner in the H2020 project GROW Observatory, which focus is on the promotion of citizen observatories activities in Europe (e.g. data collection and participatory governance on environmental issues). FAO is especially in charge of leading the Observatory Policy Interface (OPI) aiming to:

- Bring the results of the project to the attention of policy makers and relevant stakeholders (e.g. farmers group, extension services/advisory boards, etc.)
- Contribute to promote participatory governance: bring the citizens into the policy making process and make sure that they are heard by policy makers
- Ensure the sustainability of the project beyond 2019.

Inaugural Meeting of the G20 Resource Efficiency Dialogue, 27 November 2017, Berlin, Germany

The G20 agreed at the Summit in Hamburg to launch a G20 Resource Efficiency Dialogue. The G20 Leaders' Declaration states: "The G20 Resource Efficiency Dialogue will exchange good practices and national experiences to improve the efficiency and sustainability of natural resource use across the entire life cycle, and to promote sustainable consumption and production

patterns.” Germany hosted the Inaugural Meeting of the G20 Resource Efficiency Dialogue which took place on 27 November 2017, Berlin.

GreenerSites - Environmental Rehabilitation of brownfield Sites in central Europe

GreenerSites seeks to improve the environmental management of un- or underused industrial areas. The project aims to achieve this through the definition of strategies and tools that are based on a sustainable, integrated approach to make functional urban areas (FUAs) cleaner, healthier and more liveable places. Project partners will bring about a shared and enhanced knowledge on integrated environmental management of brownfields.

They will also reinforce capacities of the public sector to plan and carry out brownfield regeneration and produce well-defined sustainability measures and tools to ensure the effectiveness of environmental planning. GreenerSites will build on know-how from previous EU projects and existing networks. Main outputs of the project will be:

- A common tool for brownfield regeneration stemming from the preliminary analyses conducted in 9 central European FUAs;
- 9 strategic action plans defined in two steps (joint concept and full definition at FUA level after pilot phase);
- 11 pilot actions testing more sustainable and novel technical solutions in brownfields to improve their environmental performance;
- A full training package for public employees and stakeholders;
- A common transferability manual.

GreenerSites partnership is made of 11 partners from 5 central Europe countries working together to bring about a shared and enhanced knowledge on integrated environmental management of brownfields.

One of the greatest challenges facing today's environmental policymakers is how to deal with complex risks, such as those associated with climate change. These risks are difficult to deal with because they are not precisely calculable in advance. Where there is scientific uncertainty about the full extent of possible harms but 'doing nothing' is also risky, decision-makers may use the

precautionary principle. This Future Brief explores the role of the precautionary principle in EU law and policy, and examines key points of discussion drawn from the evidence.
